On February 20<sup>,</sup> 2025, the East Michigan Council of Governments (EMCOG), which consists of Arenac, Bay, Clare, Gladwin, Gratiot, Huron, Iosco, Isabella, Midland, Ogemaw, Roscommon, Saginaw, Sanilac, and Tuscola Counties, and the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe, will be hosting a Housing Review/Workshop to discuss the Michigan State Housing Development's (MSHDA) Region G's Housing Plan. The Housing Review portion of the Program begins at 10:00 am and will include speakers from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), the Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA), and The State Bank. They will highlight their programs available throughout Region G and the State of Michigan. The Workshop portion of the Program begins at 1:00 pm and will include an update on the Region G Regional Housing Partnership Plan and a work session on moving the Region G Plan forward.
